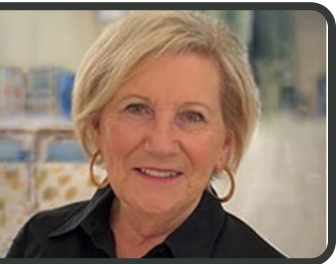

He has served as Chief of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Victoria Hospital, Associate Chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Western University, and Chair of the Medical Advisory Committee at London Health Sciences Centre. He currently co-chairs the gynecologic disease site group for the Canadian Cancer Trials Group (CCTG).

Her interests in translational research led her to complete a postdoctoral research fellowship at the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center under the direction of Drs Britta Weigelt and Dmitriy Zamarin.

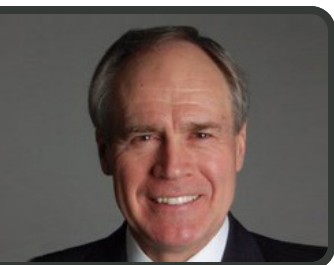

DR. HUGH ALLEN



Dr. H. Hugh Allen made a remarkable impact on women's health care throughout his career. His exceptional teaching, clinical problem-solving and surgical skills were highly regarded and have been recognized both regionally as well as globally. He trained over 120 specialists in obstetrics and gynecology at Victoria Hospital and lectured in 43 countries worldwide. His trainees credit Dr. Allen for their success in their specialties. Dr. Allen was a consistent advocate for nurses and their unique contributions to women's health care. His dedication, compassion and commitment to excellence changed the lives of thousands of women. Dr. Allen passed away in April 2025, leaving behind a legacy of care that endures in the lives he touched and the futures he helped shape.

DR. JOHN COLLINS



Dr. John Collins was an obstetrician-gynecologist and reproductive medicine specialist. He held key academic positions, including Assistant Dean for Undergraduate Medicine at Western University, Head of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Dalhousie University, and Chair of Obstetrics and Gynecology at McMaster University, where he was also a Professor in Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics. Dr. Collins passed away in February 2025, leaving behind a remarkable legacy in medicine and education.

Dr. Collins was a former President of the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Canada and the Canadian Fertility and Andrology Society, and a Fellow ad eundem of the Royal College of Obstetrics and Gynaecology. He served on the Editorial Board of the New England Journal of Medicine from 1991 to 1996 and was Editor-in-Chief of Human Reproduction Update from 2006 to 2012. He was also an Epidemiology Consultant to the Practice Committee of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine from 1996 to 2012.

His research includes over 200 peer-reviewed papers on the effectiveness, safety, and cost of interventions for reproductive health disorders, as well as the long-term cardiovascular and cancer outcomes associated with oral contraception and hormone replacement. In 2019, Dr. Collins was appointed as a Member of the Order of Canada by the Governor General.

DR. MARIE PLANTE

Dr. Plante is a Full Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Laval University and a Gynecologic Oncologist at L'Hôtel-Dieu de Québec, CHU de Québec. She was Vice-President of the International Gynecologic Cancer Society (IGCS) and is the past Chair of the Cervical Cancer Research Network (CCRN). Dr. Plante has a keen interest in minimally invasive surgery (MIS), sentinel node mapping and fertility-preserving surgery in cervical cancer. She is leading two important international clinical trials in cervical cancer: SHAPE/CX-5 and Contessa.



DR. GAVIN STUART

A native of Manitoba, Dr. Gavin Stuart attended Western University for his undergraduate medical and postgraduate training in obstetrics and gynecology. He completed a fellowship in Gynecologic Oncology at Wayne State University in Detroit, where he subsequently joined the faculty. He then moved to the Tom Baker Cancer Centre in Calgary, becoming the first Director of Gynecology. After serving as Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Calgary, he was appointed Professor and Head of the Department of Oncology and Director of the Tom Baker Cancer Centre. In 1999, he became Vice-President of the Alberta Cancer Board.
